It has been a great season both on and off the field and the Club has been able to

Highlights for the season are many and include:

On-field

- The A Grade grand final appearance and win after 47 years
- A successful combination of senior coaches with Paul Finnie and Luke Williams at the helm. We are very pleased that they are continuing with us for the next 2 seasons
- Man of match in the grand final to our captain Nick Benton
- Recent U16 Junior players (Aussie Umpherston and Jordan Thomas) – playing in the A Grade grand final
- Having up to 7 of our senior players(at any one time) representing Premier League sides during the season
- Having senior men’s players representing their State (Tim Ludeman, Andrew Mac Donald, Brenton Mc Donald)
- Having senior women’s players representing their State (Alicia Dean, Sam Betts and Amanda Wellington
- Having a representative in the U17 State team that was successful in winning their championship (Nik Kartas)
- Having 2 senior players selected in the Grade Team of the year (Nick Benton and Brenton Mc Donald)
- Receiving the “Junior Spirit of Cricket Award” by SACA at this year’s award ceremonies in recognition of our persistence and hard work in building an improved Junior program and in rigorously addressing/removing barriers and obstacles so that Junior cricket can grow within the Club.

Off -field

- A magnificent 120 year celebration event that was well coordinated and attended with support from many. Thanks to Lachy McColl for his excellent work in making this happen.
- As part of this celebration, the announcement of our Team of the Ages which included 12 men and 4 women who have a distinguished career having played /coached at Port Adelaide and played first class cricket in either representing the State or Australia. These players have been included as the first inductees into the Port Adelaide Cricket Club Hall of Fame and we congratulate them on their achievements - they include:
 - **MEN:** (In batting order): Alby Gehres, Tony Handrickan, Gordon Harris, David Pritchard, Bob Mclean, Matthew Weeks (present day player), Eric Freeman, Neil Hawke, NL Williams, T. Wall, Gordon Inkster, Peter Rundell
 - **WOMEN:** (alphabetical order): Annette Fellows, Lynnette Fulston, Karen Rolton, Emma Sampson

- Recognition from the Commonwealth Bank and the only recipient of their sponsorship program in South Australia, with prime time coverage of the Club/women's cricket on TV during the Adelaide Test- driven and coordinated by Kate Rush
- Being one of only a few Clubs to be invited and to proudly participate as Flag bearers for SACA/Cricket on Australia Day.
- A Management Committee who contributed with patience, persistence and perspiration in developing and implementing the Club re-invigoration program and objectives. In particular many thanks to the active efforts of our new management committee members-Bev Severin (Treasurer), Kate Rush (Secretary) Col Murray (Cricket Director), Lachy McColl (Fundraising), Brian Elliot (Junior Coordinator) and Brett Hill (External liaison and relationships)
- Recognition and congratulations to Lachy McColl as the PACC volunteer of the year nomination to SACA.
- Magnificent and continued support from our volunteer trainers, physios, team managers, practice managers and our scorers- their support is invaluable and appreciated
- A well-deserved thank you to the Kitchen team (Jan, Bub and Jodie) who have supported the Club for many years. Your support is greatly appreciated by all.
- A reinvigorated Junior Committee and program (after some false starts and concerns)with high quality coaches, where with persistence and patience we were able to field a second U16 team towards the end of the season for the first time for a long time and have recruited well for future years. The Rolton/Freeman Academy has also been re-invented as an important part of the program.
- A successful Kanga cricket program coordinated by SACA during the season and supported by the Club and in particular Dean Biggs. On Saturday mornings the Port Reserve was packed with young children enjoying themselves and developing a passion for cricket. It is great to see and many thanks to Dean.
- The turn-around of the Club to be solvent following many years of being technically insolvent - by implementing better governance processes and practices, improved expense control , more prudent spending and improved financial controls and financial information. This achievement should not be understated and from the Club's perspective is equivalent to the A Grade Premiership. Many thanks to all who actively contributed to this outcome.
- The integration of men, women and junior cricket into a "one club" approach. A successful, well attended and organised presentation night that for the first time included all cricket teams within the Club.
- The significant re-building of relationships with external parties, particularly SACA, other Grade Clubs, suppliers and Council and the Port Adelaide Community
- The establishment of an excellent relationship/agreement/contract/sponsorship with Kukri for the provision of clothing at high quality, with timely delivery and value for money.
- The Port Adelaide Enfield Council is planning a Civic reception for the Club in recognition of our achievements. A date has not been set yet and more information will come later.
- To the many other volunteers who contribute time and effort to support the Club we say thank you

- Our key sponsors whose support is invaluable are very much appreciated. Some of these include the Alberton Hotel, Mc Fence, GSI Consulting, Meat works, Top Cut Meats, Evida café, Pan Pacific International, Adelaide Brighton Cement and Adelaide Business Hub- just to name a few- and many thanks to others who have provided donations or in-kind support.

We need to remain vigilant in progressing our objectives in the coming years as highlighted in our future directions document (refer separate document). We have completed the second year of our reinvigoration program/plan and have achieved success. We still have lots to do and have a long way to go, to back up last season's outcomes and to show that it can be sustained both on and off field.

There will be a number of future issues, challenges and priorities that need to be addressed including:

- **Considering our Future Direction** in light of the recommendations in the independent report on the Future Direction of Grade Cricket recently tabled
- **Consolidating and building** on our on and off-field success. In cricket terminology we have just completed our first innings and have batted well, we now need to back it up with some solid bowling, followed by a sound second innings batting and bowling effort. The end game is in sight and a solid foundation has been set, but as a Club, we are not there yet and have some way to go
- **Improving our Club cricket outcomes** across other grades within the Club (B, C and D Grade) and further developing women's cricket.
- **Further building and developing our Juniors** from the foundation of last season through the enthusiasm and skill of the Junior committee and the appointment of a Junior Coordinator and Junior coach (es).
- **Continuing to create a vibrant Club atmosphere** with a focus on introducing active membership and greater use of our facilities through a considered calendar of events and an integrated "one Club" approach i.e. men, women and juniors.
- **Having skilled and active volunteers** to drive and support the Club remains a continuing issue and one that requires constant attention.

We are looking forward to an exciting and challenging future and we would invite all to stay the course and join us on this journey by either supporting the Club through active membership, sponsorship, donations and/or by providing your valuable time and skill. 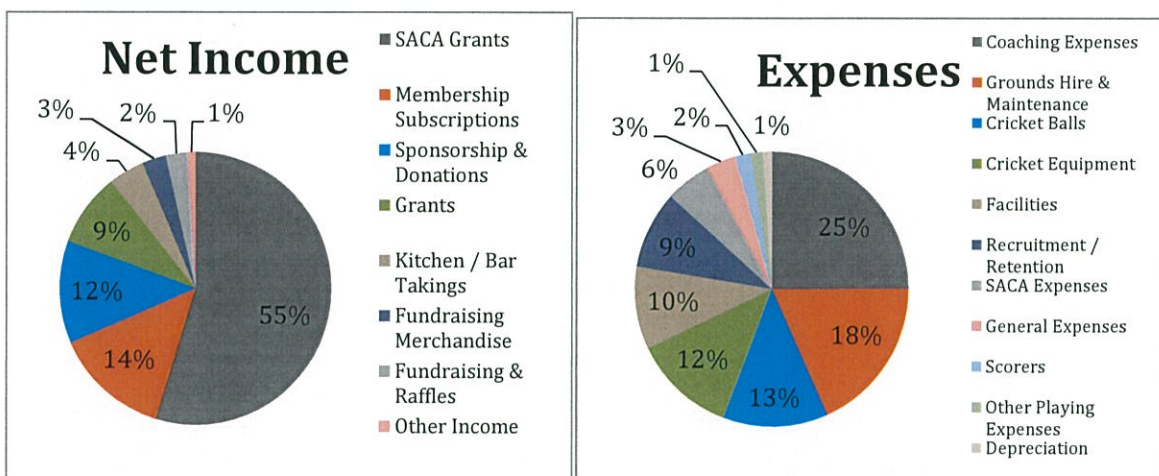
TREASURERS REPORT APRIL 2014

The following report shows the unaudited financial position of the Port Adelaide Cricket club for the year ended 30 April 2014.

The financial position of the club has increased substantially with a net surplus for the year of \$17 442.34. The club has also moved into a Net cash position for the year of \$ 14 668.10 and is no longer in an insolvent position.

The net income position was marginally down on the previous year, due mainly to the decrease in subscriptions, sponsorships and bar takings for the current year. However, expenses ended 17% lower than the previous year.



The club continues to get the majority of its funding through SACA grants. It continues to be a challenge for the club to source funding through sponsorships.

The auditor's report for the financial year ended 30 April 2013 has also been included. There was an audit qualification due to the kitchen takings not being accounted for in detail during the year. This has been addressed in the 30 April 2014 Financial report.

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Scope

I have audited the accompanying general purpose financial report for the year ended 30 April 2013.

The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members.

My Audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and statutory so as to present a view of the Port Adelaide Cricket Club Inc. which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position, the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification

It is not practical for the club to establish accounting control over all sources of income prior to its receipt by the Treasurer. Accordingly, it was not practicable for our audit of those sources of income to go beyond the stage of it being recorded as received in the accounting records of the Club.

It also has not been possible to audit the bar return as I have not received any records of bar receipts and expenses.

There needs to be auditable records kept of all bar receipts and expenses so a true and accurate record can be reported in the club's financial statements and to the club's members.

Qualified Audit Opinion

I have received all of the explanations and information we have requires, and in our opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been necessary had the limitation discussed in the qualification paragraph not exists, the financial report presents fairly the financial position of the Port Adelaide Cricket Club Inc. as at 30 August 2013, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (including the Associations Incorporation Act 1985).

This season has been characterized by the opportunity for our women's teams to be ambassadors of the Club within the community, as well as create opportunities for team and individual growth. Through sponsorship of the Commonwealth Bank and various community events, we continue to integrate the role of Club cricket with the community for which we are a part and provide platforms for female cricketers to develop their talent.

This season we fielded only 1 team, our A Grade team, which although experienced various highlights throughout the season, struggle to perform consistently. A significant challenge for the team was the lack of a coach, as well as a number of new players who brought renewed energy but less game day experience than was needed for reliable success on the field. Despite the lack of appointment of a senior coach, Captain Alicia Dean stepped up on a regular basis to provide coaching support to all players, and build the captaincy potential of our leadership group. The team received a great deal of assistance from a number of faithful supporters, including Ken & Heather Wellington, Alan Bach, Rachel Thamm and Caroline and Wayne Betts.

The team finished 5th on the Ladder for the One Day Competition and took out the wooden spoon award for the T20 fixture. However, there were outstanding performances from a number of players throughout the season, including a not out century from Alicia Dean and 5 wicket haul from Ashleigh Homes. At the end of the season Sam Betts and Alicia Dean came in 4th and 5th respectively for the Karen Rolton Medal. Port Adelaide continues to be a club that fosters pathways to elite levels of the game for women, with 3 players Sam Betts, Alicia Dean and Amanda Wellington representing the sport at a State level this season. Towards the end of the season however, Alicia Dean decided to call it an innings with the SA Scorpions, retiring after representing the state since her 2004-05 debut.

This season SACA initiated a Female Junior Development Competition and Port Adelaide were proud to be represented by 2 juniors in this fixture, overseen by Trina Rosenberg. Whilst fairly new to the game, both girls demonstrated a determination and commitment to the game that will no doubt continue to characterize their play in seasons to come. Working alongside the broader club's junior development strategy, we are keen to see our contribution to this competition grow into the future.

The women's playing group and their supporters are looking forward to next season and are seeking to continue to integrate with the Club and its future directions. Our focus continues to be the growth of the women's competition, building consistency in training and on ground performance, creating pathways for elite players and strengthening our ties and contributions to the Club and community.
