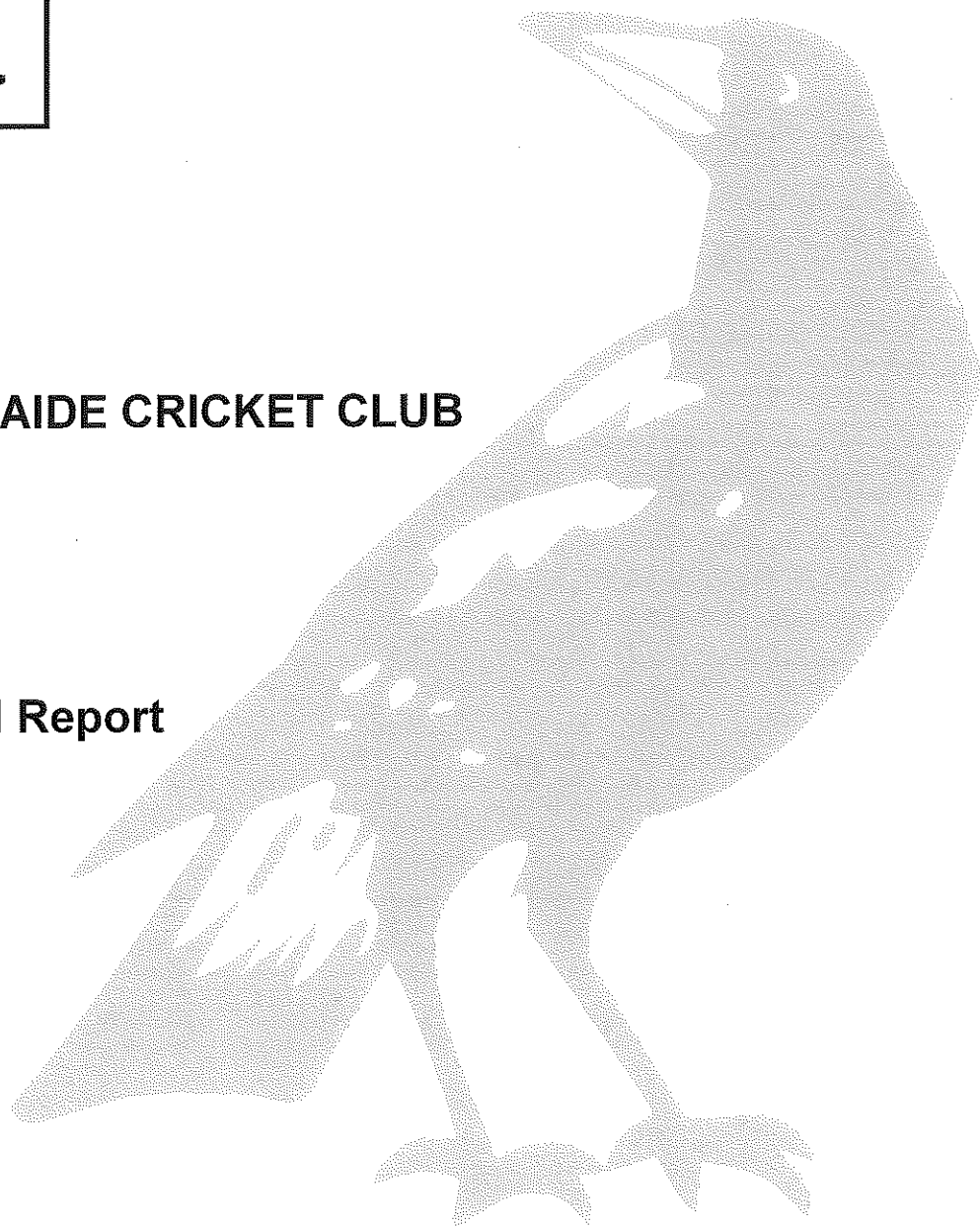


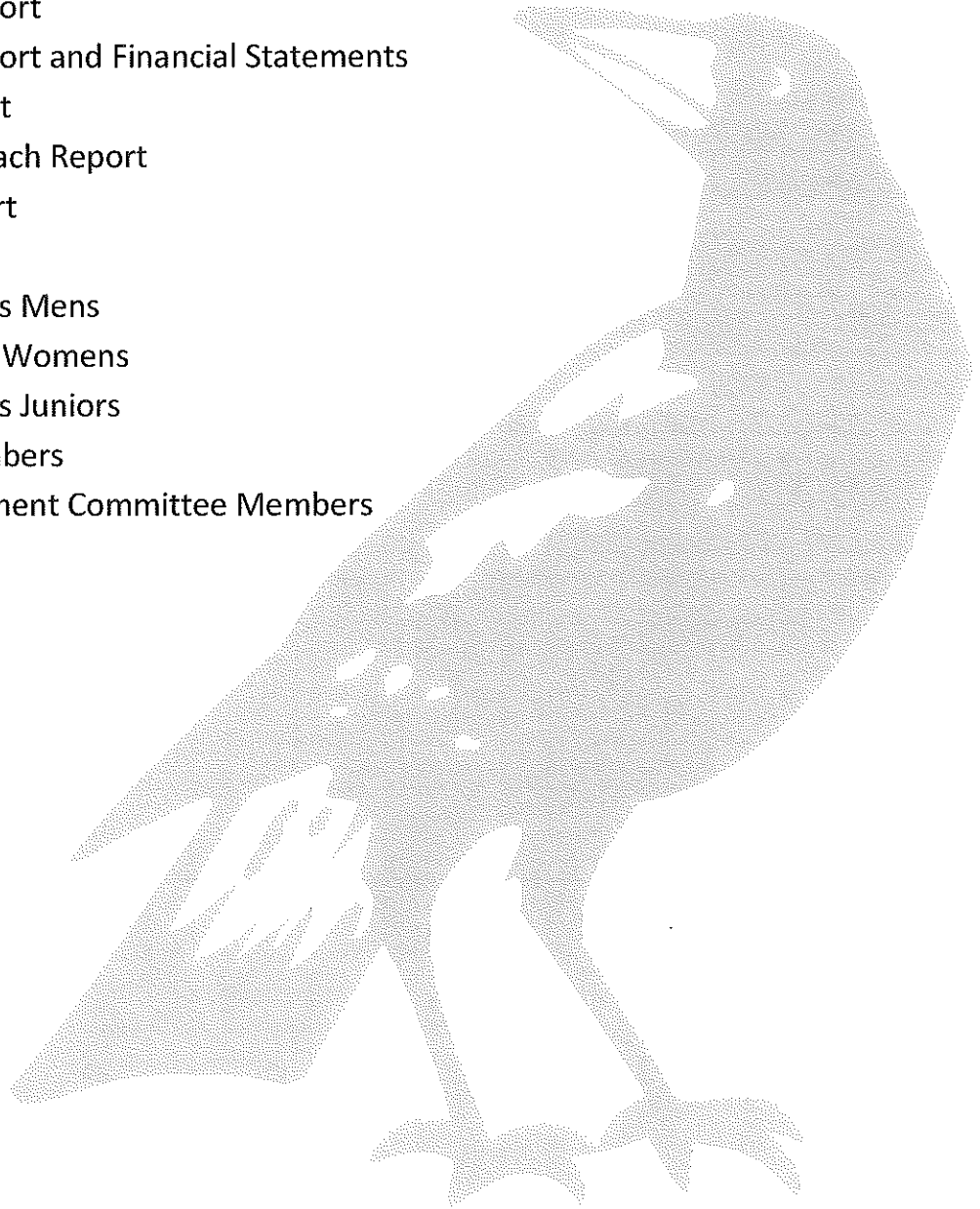

CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT SEASON 2017/18
July 2018

Thank you for all attending the AGM.

The AGM is one the most important meeting of the club as it is a chance for individuals to become more involved in the management and operations of the club.

Firstly, I would like to thank our sponsors for their continued support throughout the 2017/2018 season. Without their sponsorships the club would not be able to provide the excellent amenities and facilities that we do:

Thank you to the management and sub-committees for their efforts throughout the year and all the volunteers including coaches, team managers, scorers and those who organise clothing, balls, kitchen, bar, fundraising, events, newsletters. These people support the Club by giving up their time to assist in the running the club and providing cricket facilities and social events to all the members which includes in excess of 120 playing members participating in Mens, Women's and junior cricket and 50 social members and 40 volunteers. I know these people volunteer for these roles not for personal gain or recognition but to help the club and the members. I would like to ask that other members also consider taking on a more active role within the club.

In support of our reason for existing (to develop high performing players to represent our Club at South Australian and National level), the club:

- Has a strong development focused program designed and implemented in alignment with SACA and CA objectives and pathway:
- Has a highly skilled coaching panel across Mens, Women's and Junior's with the group's qualifications including:
 - Seven coaches with Level 2 qualification
 - Seven coaches with Level 1 qualification
 - One coach with a Certificate III in Sport (Coaching) qualification
 - Four coaches who are ACA members
 - Six coaches that have represented South Australia at First Class level

- Two coaches funded through ACA Premier Program (Matthew Weeks & Dave Mundy)

We have a unique, clearly defined and communicated focus and “reason for existing” that drives everything that we do, which is:

1. To develop high performing players to represent our Club at South Australian and National level; and
2. To actively support and represent the Port Adelaide Community and significantly contribute to the rejuvenation of the Port through our Club activities.

The Management Committee continues to work towards our reasons for existing by:

- maintaining a “one club” integrated and inclusive approach across Mens, Women’s and Juniors programs with key linkages and interaction – changes in one program are considered to ensure they have positive impact on others;
- maintaining a strong strategic and operational partnership (Memorandum of Understanding) with the Port Adelaide Enfield City Council (PAECC). PAECC provide and maintain excellent ovals and facilities. PAECC has also committed to the development of a Master Plan for Port Reserve that will create an integrated and iconic multi-sport facility as part of the rejuvenation of the Port;
- Significantly enhanced our communication with players and members and our supporter and community engagement with a digital strategy including email newsletters, club website, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram;
- Building stronger and professional relationships with other Clubs and SACA through active contribution to implement change and a more strategic approach to cricket within the Grade Cricket Committee.

The PACC are continuing to have positive discussions with SACA and the Grade Cricket Committee in implementing Game Development Programs targeting the Port Zone and NW Metro with the aim of encouraging more junior involvement, participation and cricket programs at schools through a combined PACC/SACA collaborative approach. This is a long-term journey and program established to arrest the declining interest and participation of cricket at Schools and therefore progression to Community Clubs and the PACC.

The 2017/18 season saw the implementation of our new Junior Program and structure and as a result we fielded 2 -U16 teams , 1 -U14 team, and our Freeman/Rolton Academy. As well as teams in

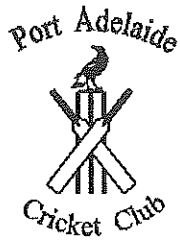
u12 Shield, Ray Sutton Shield and U17 Shield. We also implemented a formal Freeman/Rolton Academy on the Eyre Peninsula with approximately 40 participants. Some very positive progress both long and short term for the future of the Club.

The Port Adelaide Cricket Club continues to develop both on and off field with player development and good governance process. In closing the club is in good shape and the future looks positive.

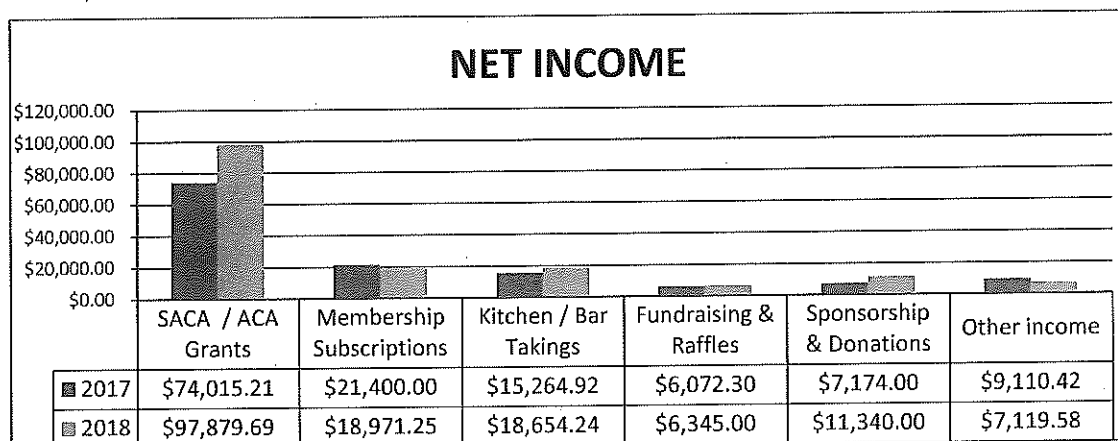
The following report shows the unaudited financial position of the Port Adelaide Cricket club for the year ended 30 April 2018.

The financial position of the club is slightly improved from the previous years. The club has also moved into a slightly stronger Net cash position for the year to \$ 43,284.46

There were a few changes this year in how we allocated clothing within the financial report and as a result clothing is shown as a separate expense line. There was also a final legal cost that fell within this financial year. Income from SACA has increased primarily due to reimbursement of our legal fees incurred during the demotion and merger process initiated by SACA that we successfully defended.

The club has shown a small loss for this year but is in a strong financial position



The club continues to receive the majority of its funding through SACA grants. We continue to address the challenge for the club in sourcing funding through sponsorships. We are very fortunate that we have continuing major sponsorship from Bridgestone Select Port Adelaide, Alberton Hotel, Maritime Constructions, McFence & many others. In this past season, Bridgestone Select have significantly increased their sponsorship levels in a 3 year arrangement

Auditor's Report to the Members**

Scope

I have audited the accompanying general purpose financial report for the year ended 30 April 2017. The Committee is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial report and the information contained therein. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members.

My Audit has been conducted in accordance with Australia Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in a material respect, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and statutory so as to present a view of the Port Adelaide Cricket Club Inc. which is consistent with our understanding of its financial position, the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.


Qualification

I have received all of the explanations and information we have required, and in my opinion, except for the effect of such adjustments, if any, as might have been necessary had the limitation discussion in the qualification paragraph not existed, the financial report presents fairly the financial position of the Port Adelaide Cricket Club Inc. as 30 April 2017, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (including the Associations Incorporations Act 1985).
